Lemonade and cookies will be served.



## Vegetation Committee Update

### **DNR Pilot Program**

The Vegetation Committee of Sugar Lake applied again this year for the pilot program. We were pleasantly surprised when we were selected. This will mean several things to our Invasive Species efforts:

- As part of this pilot program we should be able to treat all the Curly leaf pondweed and Eurasian water milfoil that we can find at reasonable concentrations.
- We will get additional DNR staff time from individuals in the Invasive Species division.
- The DNR will reimburse SLA for \$23,000 for our treatment expenses.

From the DNR Pilot Project Grant announcement:

The purpose of offering these funds is to allow a limited number of well-planned lake-wide or bay-wide projects to control curly-leaf pondweed or milfoil or both to go forward in order to learn from them and to potentially achieve some ecological benefits from them. Each funded project will be carefully monitored so that we can better predict how and where to use these approaches in the future.

Lake-wide or bay-wide treatments are those that attempt to treat all, or almost all, of the target plant in a lake or bay. While we recognize the desire to control curly-leaf pondweed and milfoil to improve lake use, we are focusing the limited funds of this grant program on projects that are designed to provide ecological benefits, as well as providing relief from the nuisance conditions caused by the plants. Ecological benefits include increases in the frequency or abundance of native submersed plants and, in the case of curly-leaf pondweed, may include reductions in levels of phosphorus and algae, which should increase water clarity.

## Winter meeting

The-winter meeting was held Saturday, February 7, 2009, at Cabela's in Rogers. About forty Association members attended. After a little bit of news about upcoming association activity Carolyn Dindorf of Fortin Consulting spoke. She covered how water quality affects property values and how we affect water quality. She provided specific details about practical things we can all apply on our own property as we care for our yards, deal with rain, plant gardens, wash our cars, deal with weeds and fertilizer, and minimize erosion. All in attendance received several handouts from Carolyn with tips for lake protection, resources for lakeshore property owners, and an invasive household plant inventory sheet. Karen Sutherland also provided seed packets of a native blue aster for everyone.

## Water Quality Committee Update

### **Hollister Creek**

The Hollister Creek project did well last fall and this spring. The project will be watched, when the grasses are established enough, the new creek bed will be opened and the old creek filled and seeded. We expect that to be mid to late summer.

### **New Projects**

We are always looking for new projects that will improve the water quality of Sugar Lake.

Two new project concepts have been presented to Wright SWCD to submit to the engineers for final design and pricing. When the designed projects are completed, they will be presented to the land owners for comment. If the landowners agree with the projects we will proceed to the funding phase. More on this later.

### **Filter Strips (on farm land)**

Our participation in the Wright County buffer strip project has completed the first five years. At this point we are again being asked to continue the program by participating at a 50% rate for the continued funding of these projects. This money funds the filter strips on farmers land by paying them an annual fee for not farming that portion of his land.

The Board voted to continue participation in the Wright County buffer strip program.



## Birders' Corner

## Star Lakes Program

This new program was created by a bill that was passed last year by the Minnesota Legislature. It provided \$100,000.00 to get the program up and running and start to designate Star Lakes and Rivers in Minnesota. The legislation specified a 15-member board to be composed of 10 appointed members and 5 members from lake associations. Dale Gustafson was nominated to the board by the state Board of Water and Soil Resources. And now serves as president of the Board.

The Board is fully operational at this time and has proposed legislation that is moving forward to grant \$250,000.00 in FY 2010, and \$500,000.00 in FY 2011 to the Star Lake Board from the money collected from the Clean Water, Land and Legacy Amendment Bill that you passed last fall. It is the Boards feeling that our bill has a good chance of surviving in some form and the Star Lakes and Rivers program will continue.

The goal of this Board is simple. We want to reward good groups and encourage new groups to carry out actions that protect and improve Minnesota's waters. It will recognize groups of people (not just nice lakes or rivers) that have come together to protect the waters.

SLA has an excellent possibility of becoming one of the pilot lakes in this program. If we choose to pursue the selection process we could be one of the first Star Lakes of Minnesota. This designation will give us status as an outstanding association, along with some monetary award along with the selection. Also, with the selection, SLA will be eligible to compete for future funding of special projects we wish to do.

## Shoreland Habitat Program


Shoreland Habitat grant activity for this year has started. The first of three workshops has been held and site design is almost complete on the first two projects.

Saturday, April 25, the first of three workshops was held at the Ney Nature Center. Attendees learned about site assessment, site planning and design, resources for design and plant selection, and specific local native plants and flowers. Worksheets to use for site assessment and objectives were passed out as well as a Wright County native plant guide. The workshop was led by Carolyn Dindorf of Fortin Consulting. The remaining two workshops will be held May 30 and June 20. Both will be held on site at an active project and will include classroom and hands on work with site prep and planting. The May 30 session will specifically cover refining your plan, site planning and preparation, tools, techniques and tips.

The May 30 class will be held at 11215 Hollister Ave NW from 8 am to Noon

The two projects scheduled for completion before June 30 are both in area K at 11215 Hollister Ave NW, Peterson's, and 11245 Hollister Ave NW, Delbow's. Two additional projects were identified at the workshop held April 25. Projects for this grant are required to have at least 75% of the frontage restored with an adjacent buffer zone at least 25 feet deep/wide. A landowner agreement is also required.



# South Public Access Improvements

The drawing below details improvements to the south public access started last fall. Tryg Hanson with the DNR Parks and Trails division told us the contractor was unable to complete the paving work last fall but will be working on it as soon as possible this spring. As soon as road restrictions are lifted, the contractor will need 3 to 4 days to complete the paving portion of the job. At that point the south access will re-open to vehicle traffic. Road restrictions will most likely come off between May 8th and 15th. Updates will be communicated by email—newsflash as they are available.

Although the access will have basically the same footprint, some of the upper level parking stalls have been lengthened and a new launch ramp made with 5 foot by 12 foot concrete planks should be an improvement. The design also includes a rain garden and the DNR is working with the SLA to include additional native plantings.


