## Vegetation Committee Update

- We have been approved by the DNR for \$20,000 for help with the Curly leaf pondweed treatment.
- Our permit request is in and we paid the \$750.00 fee
- The DNR has started to survey the lake for curly leaf pondweed. Treatment areas will be defined as soon as the survey work is complete. Treatment will most likely happen, weather permitting, the first week of May. The most up-to-date information regarding treatment will be sent in an email newsflash.
- Your dock or shoreline will be posted if your area is treated. We will also send a newsflash detailing the treatment plan. Do not use lake water for irrigation if your area was treated.
- The DNR forced us to start from scratch in obtaining treatment signatures this year. Nothing we had from the past would be acceptable. Thank you to all who participated in collecting signatures and thanks to all of you who signed. We apologize if you were contacted multiple times and thank you for your patience and understanding. Signatures collected this year should be good for three years.
- We plan to do our own treatment of EWM this year in late June or early July. We will be doing our own searching and plan to treat it with our own people.

## Water Quality Committee Update

We plan on planting more Bull Rush this year in late July or early August. We are interested in developing more sites. If you are interested in helping or planting at your property email Dale Gustafson at dalegus@earthlink.net.



 We also hope to do one or more major water diversion/rain garden projects. We are having trouble getting engineering help at affordable prices, so we will attempt to do it ourselves. We understand the basics and can hire good installers to do the work.

### Carp Trap Vandalized

The carp trap/gate in the outlet stream at the north end of Sugar Lake has been vandalized again this year - within the last two weeks.



A 3 X 3 foot section directly under the gate, under water, was cut out. This criminal activity is beyond vandalism and is an escalation of the lock cutting that took place last year. Whoever did this had the tools and skill to use them.

A report has been filed with the Wright County Sheriff.

The primary purpose of the gate is to keep carp out of Sugar Lake. An increase in the carp population in Sugar Lake will result in declining water quality. Carp stir up sediment from the lake bottom. The individual responsible for this criminal activity is potentially affecting property values of every property on Sugar Lake. We all work very hard and contribute towards activities to improve our water quality. We need to work together now to apprehend this person. Don't let one bully dictate what happens with the carp trap that has been installed at the lake outlet for so many years.

## Sugar Lake Association Awarded \$5,000 Minnesota Waters Grant

The SLA has been notified that we are one of seven organizations out of 27 applicants to be awarded a 2010 Lakes and Rivers Conservation Partnership Grant by Minnesota Waters. The \$5,000 grant will be used to install two rain gardens and plant weed-filled areas at the South Public Landing with native plants. Our goals are to 1) decrease runoff into the lake at the access, 2) provide an environment that will no longer encourage trash dumping and 3) create an "idea showcase" on which to base further lakeshore improvement projects.

We plan to have the area graded by July 1 and do the planting before July 15. Exact planting dates will be published in the May newsletter. We need volunteers to help plant, check on the plants, and do any needed weeding throughout the summer. We are estimating a time of two hours for the planting and one hour per week for subsequent maintenance. Members with planting experience will be matched with new volunteers, so experience is not necessary for this exciting activity. Families are welcome to participate as a group.

The grant was funded by Michelob Golden Draft Light/ Anheuser-Busch, the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation and Minnesota Waters.

## Shoreland Habitat Program

This program provides funding to organizations that develop projects to improve the quality of shoreland habitat, expand the diversity and abundance of native plants, and enhance and protect water quality.

The Sugar Lake association is in year two of a three year grant program. Two projects were successfully completed last year and one has been identified for this year.

Projects for this grant are required to have at least 75% of the frontage restored with an adjacent buffer zone at least 25 feet deep/wide. A landowner agreement is also required.

Three excellent speakers updated members on invasive aquatic species at the winter meeting Saturday, February 6, 2010. Two new invasives to watch for are the <u>zebra mussel</u> and the <u>spiny water flea</u>. They can enter a lake through bilge water, bait buckets, livewells, fishing lines, weeds on boats and trailers, anchor ropes, even your waders! The "Stop Aquatic Hitchhikers" website referenced below explains how to clean items before putting them into the lake. It is easy and does not take very long. To illustrate the persistence of these creatures, spiny water flea eggs can live out of water for up to 12 hours and adult zebra mussels can survive for up to a week out of water! Sugar Lake deserves our careful monitoring to keep these new invasives at bay.
