Our Diane's Lights Night spectacle is just around the corner. On Saturday evening, September 3, many lake shore owners and their friends will assemble. They will once again light the night sky with their displays of luminaries and torches signaling the end of summer on Sugar Lake. Will you be one of them? It's lots of fun for the whole family and gives someone the chance to win a "summer of free Pepsi" for next year. Remember, the Groenke family (this years judges) will be looking for only flame lit displays. No electric lighting will be considered. For those of you wanting to view other displays by boat, we remind you to think about safety. Nighttime boating can be hazardous, so check your water craft for proper lighting and lifejackets. Don't overload your boat and be watchful of other boats around you. To limit congestion, we ask everyone to proceed clock-wise around the lake. If you own a floating raft, we ask you to put some kind of lighting on it such as a luminary on each corner or simply bring it in to prevent collisions. Above all, have fun and enjoy the last official weekend of the summer season. We will be paying the winners a visit on Sunday.

The tradition of lighting up the shore with luminaries was renamed in 2000 in memory and honor of Diane Radtke who started the Sugar Lights Night tradition in 1996. Diane donated the proceeds of her hand-made luminary sales to the Lake Improvement Fund and in the process created a great tradition of fun and beauty that seems to draw the Sugar Lake community together.

Dear Sugar

Dear Sugar While at the Sugar Lake Picnic last week, I noticed something called a "loon nesting platform". It was about 4 feet square and made out of PVC tubing with reeds on top of wire mesh. What are they going to do with it? **Looney idea**

Dear Looney; The nesting platform will be put out next spring for loons to nest on. The idea came from Gary Williamson, a member of the lake association. Gary owns a pheasant farm and raises 40,000 of the best game birds in the five state area. He has been in the business for 21 years, is president of the North American Game Bird Association, and really knows his stuff when it comes to birds. You might say he is a real "Bird Brain". Gary obtained the nesting plans from the DNR and wants to build 4 of them for the lake. There are only 2 pairs of Loons on our lake now, in part, because of the lack of adequate



nesting material in other areas. Gary identified 4 potential sights suitable for nesting. If platforms are put in all 4 areas, it will increase the chance that each area will produce multiple chicks. When nesting, loons are very territorial and will drive off other loons if they see them. If the platforms are put in the water at the right time and place, loons can nest safe from predators and be out of sight to other nesting loons. The day the ice goes out next spring, Gary will put the platforms in the water. They will be placed near the bull rushes on the south west corner, Addison Bay, north-west side, and the south side of the North Bay. If you see these platforms, give them a wide berth. It takes 28 to 30 days for the eggs to hatch and you wouldn't want to scare away any potential nesters. It might take 2 or 3 years for it to work, but hopefully, before long we will have more loon families on the lake. Good luck Gary!

Lake Vegetation Report Dale Gustafson

The Vegetation Committee is still working hard on vegetation efforts for our Lake. Our divers have been out several times and have located two new areas of Eurasian Water milfoil that we will add to our treatment areas. We may do a fall treatment in those areas this year. Also the divers have been doing some hand removal of EWM in Addison Bay. While in Addison Bay diving, they discover that we also have a lot of new plants growing there. This just points out that we need to keep focused on continually looking for new infestations of both EWM and Curly leaf.

We are also working on our LVMP (Lake Vegetation Management Plan) and we will continue to update you on that program. We expect that the plant identification survey will be done in September, and the lake bottom testing will be done in October. After that data is assembled we will began our strategic planning based on that information. Perhaps we will be ready to present our long range plan at the winter association meeting. We have applied for a Milfoil grant to help with costs of locating this plant and hope to hear soon about our application. These funds will be very much appreciated, but will do little to meet the needs we will have in the future.

By the time you read this, our Sugar Lakescapers should have completed some additional shoreline plantings in the areas we planted last year. We had very good results in getting bull rush established and we intend to add to it and help it grow into good size stands. This is great news because this is one of the most valuable plants for our lake's health, and we have lost so much in the last couple decades. If we are successful on a small scale now, perhaps we can move on to a larger scale in the future. Please continue to be aware of our Sensitive Vegetation Buoys and keep your wake away from these areas. Boat wakes are destructive, and it is one thing we can control. It is so important that we retain every Bull rush plant that we now have.

Vegetation Committee statement of purpose

The Sugar Lake board approved, by unanimous vote, the following statement of purpose for the vegetation committee and will consider adopting the statement as part of the bylaws.

The Sugar Lake Association desires to protect its valuable native vegetation by aggressively working to prevent invasive non-native species from becoming dominant.

<u>Area Highlights</u>

South Shore Sugar Lake by Suzanne Quinn-McDonald

As a part of the SLA plan to build a shared sense of community on the lake, this article is about past history and current events on the south shore of our lake. The land was purchased from Mr. Topfer's farm; and the cabins were built in 1955, 1956, and 1957. Historically a very social area of the lake, families hosted many campfire singalongs, shoreline corn boils, Hawaiian Luau's with live music and song skits, badminton tournaments, canoe races, and several pig roasts. One pig roast memory included the whole beach signing up for 2-hour shifts throughout the night to spray water on the frequent fire flare-ups at the shoreline spit. Another involved the Annandale bakery; they had graciously agreed to roast 3 pigs for another of the pig roasts in their large ovens, and then had to close down for a week to clear out the smell!

Creative water-skiing was also a south shore trademark. One water ski spectacular involved two boats (one with a 60 horse mercury, and the other with a 100 horse mercury motor and a prop designed especially for the event) that pulled up 13 skiers. While very exciting, the event was nixed when one of the skiers was caught in a rope and dragged underwater for a ways- events in the future involved slalom courses. The huge walls of spray were beautiful to behold.

Ed Quinn the area communicator for area O also holds the honor of "father of the fleet", the founder of the Sugar Lake sailing club which was a group of sailing enthusiasts from around the lake who held regattas on the lake from 1979 to 1987. M-16s, C-scows, and Catamarans were frequently seen whipping across the waves on Sunday afternoons.

Current events on the south shore include the recently finished 106th street project, a 20 year effort to build a new road behind the cabins nearest to the south shore access with a holding pond to filter the runoff water from the farmer's field before it reaches the lake. Many of the cabin owners on the south shore have also joined the association's efforts to promote buffer strips by letting their hillsides and shorelines grow.

<u>Fundraising</u>

We are at a critical time in our fight against aquatic invasive species. Specifically Eurasion watermilfoil and curly leaf pondweed. Spending has exceeded income and projections indicate the need for higher levels of spending. Areas infested with curly leaf pondweed have doubled every year since 2003. If this trend continues we will be faced with 100 acres of curly leaf choking the shores of Sugar Lake next spring. Much is being done this year including development of a LVMP (Lake Vegetation Management Plan), negotiations with the DNR for permitting next year, and accurate identification and mapping of areas requiring treatment. Experience on other lakes has shown we are in a 3 to 5 year fight to gain control. A fundraising committee has been formed to evaluate how to raise the additional funds that will be required to gain control of this problem. Those who have already donated will be recognized in a future newsletter. Look for information from the fundraising committee soon. 
