## Diane's Lights Night By Doc Williams



## **Vegetation Report**

Dale Gustafson - Vegetation Committee

This is the time of year when we can say we are done treating invasive species; however, we will be monitoring the plants we have treated and planning for what we will do next spring. We make our plans and then nature changes them for us. We adjust our plans and continue on!

This method of operating must be working for us because this year we treated 23.5 acres of Curly leaf pondweed and 12.44 acres of Eurasian water milfoil. For a lake our size - and with the volume of boats entering our lake - that is a pretty small area of invasive plants. We have adjusted our approach somewhat by treating the denser areas of these plants. Where the plants are less dense, they do not pose a problem for us as long as we can successfully treat them before they crowd out the native plants.

Our new equipment is serving us very well and we are developing some good maps of invasive infestations. With this information we can keep track of changes and be ready to react. We must keep vigilant to protect our lake in the future.

We are able to keep the invasive plants in check up to this point because of the generous donations all of you have made to our association. Thank you for doing that year after year. It really has made a difference for Sugar Lake.

Picnic photos by Cindi Peterson and Ken Vande Steeg Perfect weather drew a crowd of about 700 for this year's picnic.




