Lake Association of the Year

The following is from the Minnesota Waters announcement of Lake Association of the Year for 2010. Congratulations to the entire Sugar Lake Association membership for your part in making us a candidate for this award.

Minnesota Waters, the statewide non-profit dedicated to empowering citizens to protect and improve the lakes and rivers of Minnesota, announces its 2010 award winners, selected from nominations around the state.

The nominations revealed an impressive and heartening number of water quality achievements made by citizen volunteers across the state, but the four award winners were notable for demonstrating success in collaborating with other individuals and groups. "There is a best and brightest in every community - a diligent person or group who goes the extra mile and inspires others to support and enrich our state's water legacy," said Marian Bender, Executive Director of Minnesota Waters. "The efforts of these individuals and organizations serve as a model for all who live by and take pleasure in our lakes and rivers. I congratulate them for their outstanding work to protect and enhance our state's greatest resource."

The Sugar Lake Association (SLA) was named the Lake Association of the Year, sponsored by HDR Engineering.

The honor recognizes a group whose committed and enterprising members achieve successful outcomes in lake management while forging productive connections with the surrounding community and government agencies. Serving residents of the Sugar Lake area since 1972, SLA boasts a membership of approximately 350 members; over 80 percent of the lake's private shoreland owners as well as many nearby property owners are association members. Each year, twenty six members of the SLA serve as liaisons to the entire lake population. Members also man a Wright County Sheriff's water patrol, harvest invasive plants such as milfoil and curly leaf pondweed, mark sensitive vegetation areas with buoys, plant and maintain shoreland restoration projects, and staff both public accesses on Memorial and Labor Day weekends to remind boaters to check for invasives. SLA was awarded a Conservation Partnership Grant by Minnesota Waters to restore the lake's south public landing by installing two rain gardens and planting native species in weed-filled areas. SLA was accepted into the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR) Whole Lakes Invasive Treatment Program and, under DNR guidance, has treated large areas of the lake with low doses of herbicides; the curly leaf pondweed treatment was so successful last year that no cutting/removal was required for the first time in several years. DNR also awarded a three-year Habitat Restoration Grant to SLA which has funded two completed shoreland restoration projects with work started on a third. SLA has also partnered with DNR to maintain a healthy, diverse fishery and to maintain a carp trap/barrier to keep rough fish out of the lake. With Wright County Soil and Water (WCSW), the association completed the Hollister Avenue Project, which created a new creek bed for Hollister Creek to act as a filter for farm runoff. SLA also partnered with WCSW to do wetland delineation for the Sugar Lake watershed and to create a buffer strip program whereby acreage within the lake watershed is seeded with native grasses to filter drainage. The association has partnered with a wide range of individuals and community and government groups. Sugar Lake Association uses newsletters, a website, and emailed news flashes to keep its members educated and updated. It provides funds for members to attend local and state-wide workshops and meetings related to improving water quality. SLA also provides for member involvement by sponsoring many community events throughout the year..

Water Quality

We are ready to close off the old Hollister Creek and start the water flowing through our new channel. Based on recent weather, we will wait until we have a period of dry weather to conduct the grading and filling. This new channel should retain water from the heavy rains and slowly release the water over an extended time. Also the new channel is well vegetated and we do not expect the type of silt flow we have had in the past.

We are looking at projects for our Rain Water Run-Off Management plan and getting estimates for these projects to become part of our potential project list. If you know of areas of excessive run-off or washing of silt into the lake, please let someone on the Water Quality committee know about them.

We are also planning our annual bull rush planting project and are looking for other sites where we can attempt to get them started. Let us know if you have a potential area.

Vegetation report

We did treat 53 acres this spring on the very last day that treatment is allowed. In Sugar Lake, the vegetation starts to actively grow later than most lakes. The problem with late treatments is that the research says that when water temperatures reach about 60 degrees, the chemical we use for treating Curly leaf starts to act differently and it then can effect other native plants as well. Some parts of the lake we treat probably had water temperatures that were slightly over 60 degrees, and we could see some leaf burn on the large leaf pondweed, but those plants seem to be recovering fine with no loss of plants.

Our treatment seems to have controlled Curly leaf again. We do have some small areas still showing, but nothing very significant. All things considered, we were very successful with our treatment again this year.

We have spotted some areas of Eurasian water milfoil and have submitted a request to treat an area in the north west corner of Addison Bay and an area on the west side around where the resort used to be. We plan to identify these areas with gps and have the DNR review them so we could treat them soon. The treatment we will use for treating EWM is a 2,4-D based product that will require not irrigating in those areas for about two weeks after treatment. We will give a news flash warning and signs will be posted, but people in these areas will need to turn off automatic irrigation systems. We will attempt to post as much advance warning as we can.

Fundraising

Thank all of you who have donated money beyond the basic dues amount. These contributions will allow us to treat invasive aquatic species according to our plan.

We will be able to continue the work of maintaining and improving the water quality of Sugar Lake to the benefit of all property owners.

We had planned on publishing additions to the list of extra donators published in the May newsletter but will wait and publish a complete list in the July newsletter.
