## Vegetation report

As you should know, the treatment for Curly leaf pond weed completed May 17 and 24. The effectiveness of that treatment appears to have been good, but curly leaf could still be developing. We have hired PLM Lakes and Land Management to do a complete plant survey for us this year. They will do the first of two surveys sampling about 275 locations on the lake in June. That survey will give us a better idea of how much Curly leaf pond weed exists.

We are starting to locate Eurasian water milfoil in the lake at this time and plan to do our own treatment of Eurasian water milfoil in July. We will use a chemical that will have a period of restriction for irrigation. We will test the treated areas and let people know as soon as possible when it is OK to irrigate again. Watch for notices on the Sugar Lake News Flash, and be ready to have your automatic irrigation turned off when the treatment is done.

We need everyone looking for areas of Eurasian water milfoil, and Curly leaf pondweed. If you find areas of these plants please contact the Vegetation Committee or any Board member or Area Communicators with the location you have found.

## Public Landing Inspectors.

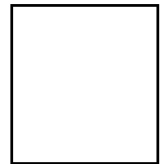
