# **Vegetation report**

#### **Treatments:**

The treatment for Curly leaf pondweed went very well again this year. It was expensive, but we were able to control the Curly in most of the lake.

We have completed the delineation of where we plan to treat the Eurasian water milfoil this season. We plan to treat the week of July 9th so you should expect to see a new batch of signs along the shore and in the water. We recommend that you shut off your automatic irrigation for that week. This chemical has different properties, and you should read the restrictions on the label carefully. Also watch for a news flash announcing the treatment. We plan to test after the treatment to be sure it is safe to start watering your delicate plants with lake water. This chemical does NOT have any effect on grass, but if your irrigation included sensitive shrubs, flowers, or vegetables there could be a problem.

We are spending more money this year because the DNR is not reimbursing as much as in the past, and with the mild winter we feel we had more invasive plants to treat than other years. Both of the chemicals we are using have new labels and different ways to interpret how much to use. This has led us to being allowed to better treat the areas we need to control.

Our treatment of Eurasian water milfoil will also be more expensive because we have located the bad infestations in deeper water so we will need to use more of the chemical to be effective. The price for the granular materials to treat at this depth is almost 3 times more expensive than having the treatment done for us with liquid chemicals. We intend to have it done. At this time it looks like we will probably treat about 20 acres of EWM. See page 5 of the newsletter for a map of the planned treatment areas.

#### **Buoys:**

We put out buoys to mark the bullrush as sensitive vegetation. In the process of doing that we found that we need to replace some of the very old buoys and add a couple more to cover some new areas. Watch for the buoys and keep motorboats away from them. The bullrush are very important to healthy lake ecology.


# **Fundraising**

# **Lake Improvement Committee:**

After experiencing the high amounts of rain and flooding in the Hollister Avenue area on the southeast corner of the lake last year we knew we had a serious problem. We discovered that with the current situation we can not protect the water quality of the runoff entering the lake. From a standpoint of lake water quality we need to attempt to find a way to slow the volume of water reaching the lake during the abnormally heavy storms. In addition there is very valid concern about protecting properties in that area.

About fifteen years ago we started a new effort to work on this problem. Our very first option was to see if we could attempt to negotiate a way to slow down the runoff from the adjacent fields south of the woods. In spite of our efforts, we were not able to devise a plan that protected the farming operation to the satisfaction of the landowners up on the hill. It is easy to understand that farming the land is how our neighbors make their living, and they need to be able to manage that land in a similar fashion to the rest of the land they farm.

I am happy to report that the Water Quality Improvement committee has had very cordial and productive meetings with our farming neighbors. The farm community is willing and anxious to be part of the solution to the problem. With their new input, and the known concerns from the lakeshore owners we are ready to have the engineers start working possible solutions. Our plan is to gather these ideas and then meet again with the shareholders. Our goal is to come up with a solution that can be supported by everyone with equal contribution to the investment needed to solve the problems in this area. It is a difficult task, but we are approaching it with optimism and a spirit of cooperation.
