#### **Chair's Corner**

On our annual SLA membership forms we have three possible funds to support. The Milfoil and Invasive Species Fund is listed first. We all know about our successful treatments of Eurasian watermilfoil and Curly leaf pondweed and our effort to keep zebra mus-



sels out of Sugar. Many of us have bought an acre to support this work. The General Fund is next, clearly used for regular expenditures of the Association. Number three is the Lake Improvement Fund. It is not often foremost on our minds or a topic of conversation. In the next few months, the Board will discuss supporting lake improvement projects with a goal of a healthier Sugar Lake. Some projects will be large. Some will be small. We might be able to divide some into pieces with work on those pieces being done at different times. We will try to obtain outside funding for as many projects as possible. The underlying philosophy is to get the biggest bang for the buck in lake quality improvement.

How you can help: The recent record rainfalls have given us all an opportunity to view areas of runoff into the lake. Report these to a Board member. Do you, as I, have an area on your property that has not dried out for the past several weeks? It is squishy to walk on and impossible to mow. I can only imagine how different my small swamp would look if it was planted with native grasses whose several foot long roots far surpass those of my current struggling turf grass. I'm thinking rain garden. Are you considering a new driveway or outbuilding? Make sure your project is designed to limit runoff into the lake. If you need additional information, consult a board member. If you have a potential rain garden, let me know. Native plants do multiply and we now have enough extra native plants at the south access to populate several rain gardens.

With careful observation and judicious use of resources, we will ensure a legacy to be proud of for future generations of Sugar Lakers.

#### Vegetation report

This is a strange year for the Vegetation in Sugar Lake. The Curly leaf pondweed has only now developed, and in smaller amounts than we expected. We did not treat Culy this year, but most likely we will have to treat next year.

We expect that to treat Eurasion water milfoil the week of July 9th. An e-mail flash will be sent out and you should see signs where the treatments were made. Most of the areas will be well off shore so you may not have signs posted on your property. The chemicals disperse very rapidly so there is no worry. Just don't drink a lot of lake water. That is not a very good idea anyway.

At this time we intend to treat along the west shore near areas S, & T. Also we expect to treat in Areas G & H, and probably along the east side of the lake near areas J, K, & L. There are other areas we are considering but we will decide on those over the 4<sup>th</sup> of July holiday.

As we have been mapping the vegetation we have been seeing greater concentrations of native plants like Large Leaf Pond weed, Clasping leaf pond weed, and other species. Our native plants really look healthy this year.

Because of the high water level, the plants have been growing very tall. As the water level gets back closer to normal you should expect to see a situation that looks like the plants have over grown. That is not the case, they will just look thicker and taller because the water level will be lower (we hope).
