Vegetation Report

This spring the invasive species efforts are full of good news and bad news. The hard part is telling which is which.

Last winter the early snow on ice should have restricted the plant growth over the winter. That appeared to be true. The early warm up of the weather should have started the Curly leaf growing early, but it did not. Instead the Curly leaf started very late, and we have not been able to find nearly as much as last spring at this time. Of course that is good news if there isn't much Curly leaf, and it would be bad news if it just hasn't started growing by the time we had to treat. Also we have found Curly leaf in new places and not found it everywhere we expected it. To some extent this has happened to other lakes in the state, and the experts are scratching their heads and attempting to understand what is happening.

We don't understand exactly why, but we do know that the reduced areas where we found Curly leaf has led us to treating a much smaller area this spring. Our treatment was delayed until the last minute of the last day to give us the best results. Our treatment was made on Wednesday, May 19th. To be effective, Curly leaf treatment must happen early in the season. If we wait too long, the treatment can harm the native plants that we need present to fill in the empty areas left open from killing off the Curly. In the first few days of last week, the water temperature rose about 2 degrees a day.

Over the next few weeks we will be watching to see where and how much Curly leaf remains, and only then will be have an idea of how good our decision was.

Also we will be watching for Eurasian water milfoil and we will be doing spot treatment to control that plant in the early summer. We need to remain positive and determined to keep after these pesky plants, but our chances are good. We owe gratitude to all that help with these efforts—from the people that help gather signatures, to the spotters of the plants, to those involved in the treatments.

But we are most thankful for the support of you the members who have contributed so generously to the Invasive Species fund to allow us to have the funds needed to do battle when we can.

<u>Carp Trap</u>

As reported last month, the carp trap was vandalized earlier this year. This is the third year the trap has been deliberately damaged. The damage done has escalated each year. The purpose of the trap is to prevent carp from entering Sugar Lake. An increase in carp population will lead to a decrease in water quality. The trap can also accumulate debris which is cleaned regularly by Tim Pippo. While other obstructions downstream from the trap may impede the flow of water, debris collecting at the carp trap is not allowed to accumulate enough to block the flow of water from Sugar Lake. The Sugar Lake Board of Directors is very concerned about this vandalism and decided to offer a:

\$300 Reward for information leading to the apprehension of the person vandalizing the carp trap.
