Vegetation Report

Vegetation Committee

If you get the e-mail Sugar Lake Newsflash or you read the sign on your shore, you already know that we treated for Curly on May 17th and a small area on the west side on May 24th. The areas treated are shown on the map in this newsletter.

This treatment is possible because we are in the Pilot program to control Curly leaf pondweed on a lake-wide or bay-wide basis. As part of this program we get special help and financial support from the DNR to treat Curly leaf pondweed any place we find it with a low dose chemical treatment. This is our third of five years in the program, and we have reduced the amount of area treated and virtually eliminated the problems with excessive growth of Curly leaf pondweed in the entire lake. It appears that we will have to continue to fight this plant in the future, but it also appears that we know how to do the control. We have not seen the new growth of Eurasian water milfoil showing up in the lake yet. We know it is there, and we expect to treat that plant in late June or Early July. We need help in locating any place that EWM is growing. So, please learn what this plant looks like, and search around you shore and out into the lake. If you find it or suspect you have, please call someone on the Vegetation committee or any board member to report the location. We will come over and check and locate the plants on our GPS for possible treatment this summer. Once you learn what this plant looks like it is easy to spot. Let's all be spotters and keep ahead of these plants. Unfortunately these are the first wave of invasive plants and animals coming, but it is a good feeling to know we can manage these into the future.

The next invasive problem may be the Zebra or Quagga Mussels. Read the article later in this newsletter and get ready to join others as a ZEBRA SPOTTER. Let's see how many spotters we can have on our lake. This is simple to do and can become a ritual of arriving at the lake. Have the children or grand children go to your dock and check the ZEBRA trap to see if you have any. Watch for more info on the Sugar Lake Zebra Mussel Watch.

NOT WANTED on SUGAR LAKE Zebra and Quagga Mussel Outlaws





Why be concerned?

Zebra and Quagga Mussels cause devastating impact on municipal water systems, recreation and fisheries. Recent infestation on popular lakes such as Minnetonka, Mille Lacs, Gull, and Prior Lake bring this invasion very close to home. Even closer to home is the infestation on Fish Lake (Wright County) just to the north of us.

We need your help to STOP these mussels from entering Sugar Lake.

How can we arrest the spread?

LEARN how to identify zebra mussels.

REMOVE all aquatic plans and animals from boat, motor, trailer and equipment.

DRAIN water from live wells, bilge, and motor.

DISPOSE of unwanted live minnows and worms in the trash.

RINSE boat and equipment with high pressure or hot water, especially if moored for more than a day OR

DRY everything for at least 5 days

NEVER launch a watercraft with a suspected infection



Are you buying a used dock or lift from another lake? Are you taking your watercraft to an infested lake (such as Minnetonka, Mill Lacs, Gull, Prior Lake, or Fish Lake)?

VERY IMPORTANT: Clean, pressure wash and dry! And, ideally let dry for at least 5 days before putting in at Sugar Lake

Burning garbage in your backyard—whether done in a traditional burn barrel, wood stove, fire-pit, or at the cabin—is far more harmful to your health, our health, and the environment than previously thought.


The U.S. EPA estimates that one burn barrel (from an average family of four) can produce as much or more dioxin as a full scale municipal waste incinerator burning 200 tons per day. Burning garbage in burn barrels or fire pits creates low temperature fires (less than 2,200° F), which receive very little oxygen and produce a lot of smoke. Under these conditions, a variety of toxic substances are produced and then released directly into the air without being treated or filtered.

Curly leaf pondweed treatment 2011

The shaded areas were treated for Curly leaf pondweed May 17. Total acres treated were 53.3. If treatment was with 150 feet of your shoreline a sign on your shore would listed precautions. The product used has a label standard. The only restriction is for drinking or domestic use of the water for two weeks. That period will have ended May 31, 2011. It is safe to use your irrigation system.
