Remember, it is important for us to have records of the spreading of ZM each year until and if we get to 100% coverage if it does.

# Light Up the Lake


There will be no contest and no restriction on the type of lights.

Thank you for sharing the history of Sunset Point in Sugar Lake's June newsletter. As I was reading the history of the bell that rests on the point, I was surprised to learn that the bell originally came from the school in Lester Prairie.

I called my 88 year old dad, who had grown up in the small town of Lester Prairie, to tell him the bell from the school he once attended was the same bell that was located on Sugar Lake! To my surprise, he said he had a photo that his mother took as the bell was being taken down from the school.

He found that photo!

We'd never have known this special connection to the bell...many thanks!

## **Tidbits**



Evelyn Lund wrote in this winter about the history behind the bell located on the "Bell Point", and I thought it was worth sharing.

Cliff and Ella Biese were on Sugar Lake for at least 30 years and lived across the lake from the point where Evelyn and her family were located. According to Evelyn, when the Biese's saw all of the "goings on" over at the point, they went over there for a visit. From that point on, the Lund's and the Biese's were

friends until Cliff and Ella passed away.

Anyway, the Lund's told Cliff that they needed a "big bell" so that they could call their kids in from the lake. One Saturday in May 1950, Cliff came over in a big truck. You see, the Biese's were from Lester Prairie where they were building a new school and in the truck was the bell from the old school house! The bell was put out on the point and we've heard its ringing ever since.

Evelyn and her family occupy the two log cabins on the point and hope to be there for many years to come.
