



SLA Board Large Bog Policy

SLA has formed a bog committee and they are working on developing a policy for SLA to assist property owners with the removal of bogs that have recently floated onto your property. With the water so low one of the few benefits is that hardly any floating bogs have been encountered this summer. Members of the committee are reaching out to the DNR and other lake associations to see what we are allowed to do and what other associations are doing. CD3 Cleaning station

The SLA is partnering with Wright County Soil and Water to install a CD3 cleaning station at the south landing. CD3 stands for Clean, Drain, Dry, and Dispose. It is an easy to use, self serve, waterless cleaning system that reduces the spread of invasive species. You can see details at the CD3 website:

The SLA will be paying half the purchase price, \$16,000 and \$2,500 in site prep. Wright County Soil & Water will have ownership of the CD3 Station, perform all maintenance, and insure it.

Motion to spend this money made and passed at the June, 2021, meeting.





Some facts about Eagles from Mark

- Bald Eagles can see clearly about 8 times as far as humans can, allowing them to spot and focus on a small animal at a distance of about 2 miles.
- Their grip is 10 times stronger than humans, but they have almost no sense of smell.
- Juveniles have a brown body, head and tail, with brown & white mottled wings. Their head feathers and tail feathers changes over the next 4-5-years until they are fully white.
- They typically weigh between 7 and 14 lb., with a wingspan of 6' to 7.5'. Females are usually 1/3 larger than the males.
- Bald Eagles mate for life, unless one of the 2 dies. They may live 15-30 years in the wild.
- They have the largest nest of any North American bird. They add to it each year, and some nests can weigh as much as 2,000 pounds.



Low Water Levels in Sugar Lake

We are all aware of how low the water level is in Sugar Lake. Dan Erdmann reported at the Board meeting that we are still slightly above the low in 1988. If we go below that we will be looking at lows not seen since the 1930s.

- Be aware of how much lake water and well water you are using. Consider reducing your water use. Reduce landscape irrigation, use more efficient irrigation equipment, and check for and repair any water leaks.
- The DNR announced August 18, 2021, that portions of Minnesota have entered a drought restrictive phase. Read the news release here: https://www.dnr.state.mn.us/news/2021/08/18/portions-minnesota-enter-drought-restrictive-phase
- Low water also impacts boat operation. Be sure you can remove your boat from your lift and check out the landing site to be sure you won't have problems getting on a trailer. You may want to check out the landing ramps. A specific challenge is at the end of the concrete ramp in the lake there is a deep hole created when people power their boats on to the trailer. If you have to back off the concrete ramp you may drop your trailer wheels into the hole requiring assistance to get out.
- Finally the combination of low water and extreme clarity (17 feet this month) have led to significant vegetation growth. We can see evidence of this in how far out from shore we have emergent vegetation. Please stay out in the lake farther than you usually would for the remainder of this year to prevent cutting up the vegetation with your prop.
